With growing excitement, we entered Phase II of the Community Park Build in August 2019.

Landscaping around the entire park, including paving the walking trail, adding seating areas, planting trees and grass has really made the park come alive!

The meditation garden was completed in memory of Benedetta & Marino Zazzera. It's a beautiful area to rest and take in the sounds of nature (the birds, the babbling brook, and leaves rustling in the breeze.)

The park's walking trail connects to the Heritage Trail of the Lackawanna River Walk. Many people have enjoyed walking, running and biking around the park while using the Heritage Trail.

Continued growth is on the horizon with a pedestrian bridge connecting the Ben Mar parking lot to the park, a covered pavilion and a splash pad.

We are continuing to raise funds to meet a DCNR matching grant of \$232,800. With to the generosity of the Wilary Foundation, Moffitt Foundation, Scranton Area Foundation, Kelsch Associates and individual donations, we are 33% of the way there!

We'd like to thank the Tenyo Family Foundation and all those who made donations towards the meal give-a-ways. You helped us help many more families it this time of need.




#### Hosted 2 blood drives

Our Directors spent countless hours on Zoom calls with other YMCAs and keeping a watchful eye on the Governor & CDC's recommendations, rules & restrictions awaiting the day when we could reopen our doors. We put every effort into ensuring a safe facility for everyone who would walk through our doors by putting up sneeze barriers, spacing equipment and furniture, adding more sanitizing areas and purchasing equipment to assist in our cleaning procedures.

Everyone young and young at heart relaxed with oversized family games, listened to music by Shin Dig and went on a gourmet cookie walk.
















## A SEASON OF SPOTLIGHTS




This all could not be done without the help of our generous sponsors and committed team of elves that make it all possible. Our sponsors donated over \$15,000 alone!
